Key Tasks/Responsibilities

- Develop additional resources for the Teacher's Toolkit such as lesson plans, activities and worksheets.
- Assist the Development Education team in the promotion of the website.

Selection Criteria

- Qualifications in education (or undergoing current tertiary studies) and a demonstrated understanding of the Australian school curriculum.
- Experience in developing learning resources and educational materials.
- Excellent communication skills, both written and verbal, with experience in composing content for social media desirable.
- Working knowledge of Content Managements Systems (CMS), such as WordPress and an ability to work across multiple digital platforms.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office programs.
- An understanding of women's empowerment and gender equality in international development and knowledge of humanitarian aid is desirable.
