About the role

This volunteer position will receive exposure to the HERU Team, the CARE International WASH Team operations, and the International Programs Department. Key Tasks

- Taking final humanitarian response, Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change projects reports and evaluations to produce public-facing summaries;
- Assist in the preparations and development of CARE International's humanitarian response evaluations for recent emergency responses and production of related case studies;
- Support the contract management of humanitarian response projects and other operational tasks as required;
- Draft content for our regular WASH newsletter and distribution of newsletter using Mailchimp software;

- Support update and maintenance of the emergency WASH, CARE Australia website, Minerva, Dropbox and shared drive;
- Draft documents (such as case studies) and assist with formatting and editing documents to support the development of the HERU team and CARE International WASH Team knowledge management products;
- Other tasks as required, including coordinate emergencies information gathering from across the CARE International confederation, analyzing CARE Australia's Country Offices' Emergency Preparedness, support with Monitoring and Evaluation tasks, reviewing Emergency Preparedness Plans after disasters and updating CARE's accountability data.

Selection Criteria

- An interest in humanitarian and/or development aid and WASH;
- Demonstrated written and verbal communication skills including the ability to undertake research, edit and write reports;
- Demonstrated high level organisational and time management skills including the ability to manage workflows and balance competing priorities to ensure timely processing to meet deadlines;
- Demonstrated understanding of gender equality, women's empowerment and a commitment to CARE'S approach and values including ethnic diversity and cultural sensitivity;
- And relevant bachelor degree currently being undertaken or completed.

Desirable

- Relevant master degree either currently being undertaken or completed.
- Understanding of the international humanitarian and WASH emergency response context;
- Humanitarian field experience.
