One report was found to be unsubstantiated.

As the staff member was no longer employed, no direct action could be taken. CARE Australia made restitution with the community in accordance with their cultural practices, and a record was placed on file to ensure the former staff member will not be re-employed by CARE, and is listed under the inter-agency misconduct disclosure scheme. One report, though unsubstantiated, led to the strengthening of community feedback mechanisms, and refresher training for staff about the risks of friendly interactions being misinterpreted.
Sexual abuse	1	0	One report was made anonymously and without any documentation, and therefore could not be substantiated or unsubstantiated.
Domestic and gender-based violence (GBV)	2	2	Two reports resulted in a staff member's employment with CARE Australia being ceased. Records were placed on file to ensure both former staff members will not be re-employed by CARE, and are listed under the inter-agency misconduct disclosure scheme.
